RECOMMENDATION

That Committee of the Whole receive for information the Briefing 'Active Kings County: A DRAFT Active Transportation Plan for the County of Kings' dated March 11, 2021.

INTENT

For Committee of the Whole to receive the draft of the Active Transportation Plan and provide feedback.

DISCUSSION

The Active Transportation Plan project commenced in July 2020, with the proposal awarded to UPLAND Consulting + Design. After the background analysis, engagement strategy and completion of the first phase of community consultation, the draft plan was completed and presented to staff on February 24, 2021.


As part of the work leading up to the creation of the draft, the following guiding principles were developed:

- Improved regional connections
- Expansion of local connections
- · Creating welcoming spaces
- Prioritizing safety and concerns
- Making it easy and intuitive to navigate
- Reframing transportation values
- Supporting community resiliency

These guiding principles informed the proposed network design, as well as a series of recommendations related to infrastructure and amenities, education and programming, marketing and promotions.

The network design is pivotal to a strong and connected active transportation network. Proposed improvements to the network will help make Active Transportation a more desirable choice by connecting communities, parks, recreation, schools, workplaces, commercial hubs, tourist destinations, and other essential service hubs. In the County of Kings, this proposed network is, and would be improved with, a combination of sidewalks, crosswalks, trails, pathways, footpaths, bike lanes, paved shoulders, on-road bike routes, and more.

Additional recommendations will help influence the usability of the network design. Accompanying bike racks, picnic areas, benches, wayfinding signage, and other amenities are key to making active transportation safe, convenient, and comfortable to all users. An additional component to increasing user uptake of the network design is education and programming. Active Transportation will also be more appealing through the addition of events and programs provided by recreation departments that would



focus on educational components of the benefits, safety tips, and road/trail etiquette. Finally, recommendations around marketing and promotion will help the Municipality of the County of Kings attract residents and visitors year round to active transportation initiatives, which will support sustainable tourism and economic development spinoffs for our communities.

To date, a background analysis and preliminary engagement have been completed to inform the draft Active Transportation Plan. Public feedback on this draft plan will be gathered through surveys, workshops, static pop-up displays, and other stakeholder engagements. Following engagement on the draft, adjustments will be made to reflect input from Council and community, and the plan will then return to Council along with the implementation plan for final adoption. The implementation plan will include proposed timelines, phasing, cost analysis and budgeting, and by-law and policy recommendations.
