Background

On May 11, 2017, tenders were received for the replacement of approximately 110m of sanitary forcemain and 755m of sanitary sewer gravity pipe and associated manholes and services along Rafuse Road, in Waterville, Nova Scotia. The sanitary sewer in this area has been flagged for replacement due to the age, material and condition of the lines, verified by video inspection. This report is being submitted to Council for the award of Contract 17-04. An aerial photo of the project location is shown below:

Discussion

Tenders were reviewed for mathematical checks and compliance by Engineering Services staff.

The total tender price is \$330,681.76 at net HST, and includes a contingency amount of \$25,000 + HST, which will only be used as necessary for change orders approved by the Municipal Engineer. The budget for this project was set at \$300,000 in the 2017/18 Capital Budget. Staff recommend using the available carry-over funds from the 2016/17 Lift Station Replacements to keep this project within the overall program budget.

Re: FOLEAZE (FOLEASE) PARK SUB-DIVISION ROADS

I was listening to the MOK COTW meeting on May 16, 2017 when I heard, (under agenda item 11, Operating Budget Deliberations), that the DTIR had returned the MOK proposal for \$271,500 to cost share J-Class road resurfacing in 2017, setting the DTIR commitment at \$68,000. From the discussion, I understand that this leaves \$232,000 (\$300,000 in the budget for J-Class roads less \$68,000). On behalf of the Foleaze Park residents that have signed the petition to have our roads improved, (which was dated October 6, 2016 and received by Council), I am requesting that Council now propose that MOK cost share with DTIR in 2017, using the \$232,000 to get the Foleaze Park roads resurfaced.
