4.	Business Arising from Minutes January 11, 2018	There was no business arising from the January 11, 2018 minutes.
	Business Arising from Minutes February 27, 2018	Vice-Chair Redmond reported that Council approved the Fire Department budgets for 2018/19 at the requested 0.9% increase (or less if requested less).
5.	Presentation by Dan Stovel re: Regional Emergency Management Organization	Dan Stovel, Regional Emergency Management Coordinator for the County of Kings, provided a presentation on the Regional Emergency Management Organization (REMO).

		Dan noted that the first Kings REMO Tabletop Exercise would be held on July 20 and would be based on a hurricane scenario.
		Vice-Chair Redmond reported that he had met with Dan to discuss items in the Incident Command System (ICS) plan. He noted that he appreciated the 'bottom-up' instead of 'top-down' approach.
		Deputy Chief Skaling asked whether ICS 200 and 300 training sessions could be scheduled during evenings and/or weekends. Dan responded that these could probably be held during weekends, but that Andrew Mitton organized the sessions. He added that ICS 100 training would take place on June 11 and 12.
6.	Presentation by lan Sutherland re: Employee and Family Assistance Program	lan Sutherland, Account Executive for Morneau Sheppel, provided a presentation on the proposed Employee and Family Assistance Program for Kings County Firefighters.

		lan noted that counselling offices were available in Kentville and Wolfville and that employees could also go to Halifax for counselling.
		Deputy Chief Skaling asked whether the premium based on 9% utilization would be adjusted if usage went over 9%. Ian responded that if the program for Kings County Firefighters would piggyback on the Municipality's program, it would align with that contract. He added that usage was reviewed at the time of renewal and that adjustments could be made then.
7.	Involuntary Destruction of Property	Terry Brown explained that the Municipality's <u>Involuntary Destruction of</u> <u>Property Policy</u> had been in place since 2002. Under this Policy, property owners were able to apply for a temporary property tax reduction in case of their property having been destroyed or partially destroyed by fire, storm, etc.

		Terry noted that the County received notification of most property fires, but not all. Given that not all property owners were aware of this Policy, the County asked Fire Departments to notify Terry of any fires resulting in destruction or partial destruction of property. The County could then provide the Policy and application form to the property owner.
		Janny Postema explained that applications were forwarded, along with written confirmation of the fire, to the Property Valuation Services Corporation, which then assessed the property damage and notified the County of the revised property value.
