The Kentville Joint Fire Services Committee met through hybrid delivery on December 16, 2021. Councillor Zebian from the TOK has joined as representative in Cate Savage's place and was nominated as vice chair. Councillor Gerard remains as chair.

Fire Fighting Operating financial report and area rate were both presented by Deb Crowell. Currently the operating fund has a surplus of \$83,059. There were substantial differences noted for Insurance, which was further explained as a reflection of a switch to Northbridge Insurance Brokers which offered a more affordable rate. The savings come in at \$23,000.

Chief Hamilton presented his report and noted that he had recently met with the CAO for the TOK in regards to the Canaan Mountain tower as the KVFD is no longer using it, but there are some other departments that are. New Engine 11 which is coming from Quebec is expected to arrive in Quebec in January 2022 with its transition to Kentville shortly after. Former Engine 11 has been moved to the Plympton & Gilbert's Cove Fire Department for an accepted bid of \$50,000. Renovations to locker and shower rooms are almost complete along with some upgrades to the crew lounge; these were financed through Society money. Training has resumed with public health protocols being followed. Three new members have started the Kings County Level 1 program. Recruitment stays consistent at around 55 members. Three schools were able to participate in Fire prevention programming and it was nice to return to after taking some time off due to COVID. Tower 41 inspection was overdue because of COVID but has been completed. There were no safety concerns identified but there were quite a few other issues identified which will need to be addressed for quality service.

Some highlights noted during the presentation of the proposed Area Rate and Operations Budget for the next 12 months included an increase of 1.4% over prior year budget. Members are moving to higher levels of service and as such honoraria will increase. Training has been added as a line item which had not been in the past. There are a number of improvements on trucks that were noted. It was noted that the Camp Aldershot Contract still remains in limbo but will be charged as per today's dollar value while using the former contract. Through the area rate there will be an overhaul of the current SCBA gear. It is easier to do this as one large purchase to ensure individual masks but also so all technology is the same. The loan for this equipment will be paid over a 10-year period. Expenditures see a decrease as well during the upcoming year. All these have been further explained in the proposed budget submitted to the municipal partners. The next meeting is scheduled for March 24, 2022.
