They also recommend policies, programs and practices to eliminate racism, discrimination and exclusion; monitor the effects of recommendations; and report on changes. The committee includes (6) citizens, representing Newcomers, African Nova Scotians, Indigenous Persons, young adults and citizens at large.

Current vacancies are available for:

- An African Nova Scotian, includes African Canadians and those connected to a Historically Black Community
- A Newcomer, meaning an individual having moved to the Province of Nova Scotia in the previous five years
- An Indigenous Person, includes Inuit, Metis, and First Nations individuals
- A Young Adult between the ages of 18 to 25 inclusive at the time of appointment
- A Citizen at Large, includes those for whom English is an additional language, and those from gender-diverse and other equity-seeking groups

Appointed citizens will serve a **2-year Term from December 1, 2023 to November 30, 2025**, unless Council directs otherwise.

Appointed citizen member responsibilities include attending monthly meetings and community functions. Honorariums for appointed citizens are paid quarterly based on attendance.
