

## Wastewater Collection System

- Coldbrook
- Town of Kentville
- Village of New Minas
- Greenwich
- 22 Municipal-owned pumping stations feed the plant, plus more in ToK and VNM







## Wastewater Collection System (cont)

• Daily flow up to 5 million gallons per day

- Avg load to Regional Plant ~ 450 mg/L
  - Up to 14 lb per min of solid material coming to the plant



# Odour

#### • Odour Components

- Hydrogen Sulphide
- Ammonia
- Algae
- Raw Sewer
- Fats, Oils, Grease

"Rotten Egg" "Hair Salon / Perm" "Fishy" "Septic" "Decay"

 Each odour component requires a different treatment, and some are inter-related



## What are we doing about it?

- Cleaned all Municipal-owned pumping stations
- Installed pumps to dilute the first lagoon with water from the cleaner 5<sup>th</sup> lagoon
- Split the flow into the plant to the first two lagoons
- Upgraded the filtration system to filter problematic inorganic debris
- Engaged Subject Matter Expert last Tuesday



## **Expert Suggestions (immediate)**

 Recirculate water from lagoon 5 back to lagoon 1 to dilute the incoming wastewater to the plant, and to reduce the effective load (done)

• Establish a plan to remove more sludge more frequently (under development)



## **Expert Suggestions (ASAP)**

• Change the shape of lagoon 1

 Prevent the accumulation of sludge by optimizing fluid movement within the lagoons

 Continue with the aeration upgrade work planned for this summer (with some minor adjustments)



### How can you Help?







Be aware of what you are putting down your drains and toilets.

If it's not coming from your body, and it's not toilet paper, it shouldn't be entering the wastewater system.



## How can you Help?





 Wipes and hygiene products do not biodegrade, accumulate in the lagoon, and rot; odor.
