



Under Construction: Harvest Moon Trail Extension Underway in Grand-Pré

The Municipality of the County of Kings is working on extending the Harvest Moon Trail from the Grand-Pré Historic Site to Wharf Road.

The extension project will add another 2.14-km stretch on the eastern end of the popular trailway spanning Kings and Annapolis Counties. Construction started Nov. 3, and it is scheduled to continue weekdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for 8 to 10 weeks.

It is anticipated the new section of trailway will be finished by the end of May 2026. This may change if there are unexpected delays or prolonged weather-related interruptions. The completed non-motorized trail will be a safe and accessible recreation corridor that supports active tourism in the region and connects local historic sites, businesses, and residential communities.

The section of trailway that is in development is closed to the public until further notice for the safety of construction workers and the public. Only authorized workers are allowed in the construction zone until the new section of trail is officially open and safe to use.

The trailway extension project is funded by: Landscape of Grand-Pré, Trans-Canada-Trail, the Province of Nova Scotia, and Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA). Annapolis Valley Trails Coalition, Cycling Nova Scotia, the Nova Scotia Federation of Trails, and Parks Canada provided support and feedback for the extension.
