

Kings County, NS – With the start of hurricane season on June 1st, Kings REMO promotes Hurricane Awareness in support of building a 'Safe and Resilient' Kings County.

Each year, we witness the devastating impacts that hurricanes can cause. Hurricanes are not just a threat to coastal communities. High winds, heavy rainfall, and flooding can be

felt hundreds of kilometres inland, potentially causing loss of life and catastrophic damage to property. It is not just major Hurricanes (Category 3 or higher) that we need to worry about, but all hurricanes and post-tropical storms have the potential to cause significant damage as with Post-Tropical Storm Fiona in September 2022.

Kings County's Regional Emergency Management Organization (REMO) is committed to ensuring the safety of Kings County citizens and we're calling on you to prepare with us. Knowing your risk, making a plan, getting an emergency kit, and staying informed are just a few of the steps that you can take to get ready for hurricane season (June 1 – November 30, 2023).
