

Frequently Asked Questions: Recreation Assets

Can I use the Harvest Moon Trail (Rails to Trails) system?

No, all trail systems are closed until restrictions are lifted by the Province of Nova Scotia

I have to walk through some woods to get to a playground. Is that allowed?

No, please avoid the woods at all times until restrictions are lifted regardless of the activity.

What trails are open in Kings County?

All trails are closed. Beginning 30 May 2023 at 4:00 P.M., hiking, camping, fishing and the use of vehicles in the woods are not permitted. People can still access beaches and provincial and municipal parks, but trail systems are off limits. Camping is only allowed in campgrounds. Restrictions apply to Crown and private land. Forestry, mining and any commercial activity on Crown land, are also restricted.

I want to have a fire on a beach far from wooded areas. Is that allowed?

No. A province-wide ban on open fires is in effect because of dry conditions. Open fires are not permitted anywhere in the province. The ban applies to fires in provincial parks and private campgrounds. It also applies to backyard and/or beach campfires, brush burning and fireworks.

Aylesford Lake Public Boat Launch is closed, but will the Public Beach be opening on June 24th as planned?

The Municipality is preparing to open the Aylesford Lake Public Beach as planned on June 24th. However, the Municipality will continue to monitor provincial guidelines and restrictions to ensure we are doing what we can to keep our wooded areas and our residents safe.
