

## **VILLAGE OF CORNWALLIS SQUARE**

The Village of Cornwallis Square originated as four separate rural communities which, through a common need for fire protection, cooperated to incorporate a formal service district. Composed of Grafton and Woodville (in the middle of the farming belt) and the two communities of Waterville and Cambridge along Highway No. 1 at the edges of the agricultural district, Cornwallis Square's member communities retain their individuality and social networks.

Council's planning policies acknowledge the social boundaries which define each community. At the same time, in the interests of community planning resource management, the fundamental basis of the Municipal Planning Strategy, planning boundaries define the limits of land use designations. Council's approach to Cornwallis Square attempts to reconcile the community bounds with development objectives.

The map of Cornwallis Square, on the following page, illustrates how the planning Districts – Hamlets, Growth Centres and Resource Districts relate to the Village boundary.
